Tryon Palace Spring 2011 Homeschool Day!

What would it be like to work in the Royal Governor's house for a very small wage – or no wage at all? Would you trade a few years of freedom to journey across the ocean in hopes of a better life? Would you move into someone else's home and work for free in order to learn a trade?

Step into the shoes of the many different servants in North Carolina's past during Tryon Palace's Spring Home School Day: "A Servant's Life for Me" on Saturday, May 7th, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. You will not only get a chance to tour all our historic buildings, but can also visit our new state-of-the-art North Carolina History Center which includes the Pepsi Family Center (a special 1835 interactive village designed especially for school age children where families help the town prosper by working at the wharves, in a turpentine distillery, and at local businesses) and the Regional History Museum (with its images, audio clips, videos, and interactive kiosks), as well as participate in hands-on crafts and activities designed for this special event.

The cost for this event is \$12.00 per student (grades 1-12), \$15.00 per adult, and \$1.00 per preschooler (age 3+ – there's no charge for preschoolers under age 3), and this price includes all materials. Be sure to bring a picnic to enjoy during lunchtime, or you can purchase lunch at a local restaurant, including our new onsite restaurant, Lawson's Landing Riverwalk Café.

Advance reservations and prepayment are required to secure your spots, and space is limited. To register, just phone or e-mail me with the following information:

I will then mail (or e-mail) a confirmation letter, along with a registration form for you to return with your payment. You will pick up your ticket packet when you arrive at our new Main Ticket Desk located in the North Carolina History

Crossway/Wings Used Book Sale

The sale is on Friday May 20th from 6:00-8:30.

Set up/unloading is from 3:00 to 5:15. We ask that sellers be finished unloading and set up by 5:15 to allow for the entrance to be unobstructed for buyers making their way into the sale.

There was some concern about the availability of tables. We do have tables available, but they are limited. They are first come first serve. Sellers are encouraged to bring their own tables if possible.

If teenagers have crafts that they would like to sell, they may do so. They need to bring their own table (card size is good) and be sure to request a spot, the same as other sellers. Below the age of 13, children may sell crafts at their parent's table.

We do need volunteers to help unload from 3-5:15, and for clean up after the sale. All help is appreciated, but I do need some individuals to commit for planning purposes.

There will be 2 tables available for free items. Any items that do not sell that one wishes to leave will be donated to Rancho 3M, the orphanage which is sponsored by CrossWay.

Mission 28, the college ministry, will have hot dogs, chips, snacks, and sodas for sale. This is a great way to grab a bite while you are getting your shopping underway and support this ministry at the same time.

As this is a Wings/CrossWay sponsored event, registration is only open for members of these 2 groups through Friday April 22.

Starting April 23, I will begin assigning tables/spaces to all other interested parties. Parties outside of Wings and CrossWay may go ahead and email me, and I will keep a list. I will use this list to start assigning tables/space first come first serve when registration is opened on April 23. When you send me an email with your desire to register, please let me know which group you are with: Wings, Crossway, Homespun, etc.
